Innovation to Accelerate Discovery and Practice Change (ADAPT), leverages scientificallysupported quality improvement methods to implement evidence-based practices rapidly into routine care and improve the timeliness, quality, and safety of care delivered to Veterans and caregivers. The three Function QUERI programs address gaps in current clinical care for Veterans at risk for functional decline and disability. STRIDE focuses on prevention of disability related to immobility during hospitalization






